Malmö

Malmö, the third largest city in Sweden, is situated in the province of Skåne at the heart of the Öresund region of southern Sweden and Copenhagen. It has everything from pulsating big city life with superb shopping, theaters and opera to beautiful leafy parks and canals. The area is famous for its design, gastronomy, culture and architecture.

Ancient & modern

South of Malmö, at Foteviken, you can enjoy a live Viking experience. If you prefer to explore our noble surroundings, it really doesn't matter where in Skåne you choose to go. There are about 200 castles and mansions, offering both dashing and daunting experiences. Only minutes away, Lund awaits you with its cathedral dating back to 1100 AD, which makes it one of the oldest cathedrals in the world. One of its many admired features is the 14th century astronomical clock, which strikes daily at noon and 3 pm. Lund is a charming city with a history dating back more than 1,000 years.

If you want to become viking for a day, go on a castle tour or visit Lund, a guided bus tour is recommended. A sightseeing tour of Malmö would take in sights such as Malmöhus Castle, the oldest remaining Renaissance castle in Scandinavia, and Stortorget (the Main Square) with the City Hall and St Peter's church, the oldest building in Malmö, dating from the early 14th century. These are places that you can also easily visit on your own.

Modern architecture & design

As a contrast to the city's historical features, Malmö also offers a spectacular range of modern design. The most spectacular building in Malmö,

or perhaps the whole of Sweden, is the high-rise known as Turning Torso, designed by the world famous architect Santiago Calatrava. This 190 meter high building is located in the Western Harbor with a magnificent view over Öresund. You can find many buildings in Malmö from the Danish era, and one of the more recent buildings to be constructed in Malmö is the spectacular city library, also known as the Calendar of Light, designed by renowned Danish architect Henning Larsen. The library is situated in

Slottsparken, where you also can see Carl Milles' Pegasus statue. An interesting way of exploring modern design is to pay a visit to the Form/Design Center. Located at Lilla Torg (the Little Square) in a beautiful 19th century warehouse, the center stages exhibitions of Scandinavian design, architecture, and arts and crafts. There is also a superb Scandinavian design shop.

City life & outdoor events

Malmö is nicknamed the "city of parks" and a walk through the greenery or a boat ride on the canals is a magnificent way to experience this charming city. The "Rundan" sightseeing boat provides guided tours in English and German. A guided tour of the city will very likely give you a glimpse of the Öresund Bridge. A popular stop is at Lernacken, right outside Malmö, from where you get the best view of the bridge connecting Sweden and Denmark.

Within walking distance of downtown Malmö you find the sandy beach of Ribersborg. Take a swim in the ocean or enjoy the beautiful Kallbadhuset from 1898, a popular destination for swimmers and café guests alike, who can enjoy saltwater swimming and a wood-fired sauna. Öresund offers sensational sailing and in summer 2005 Malmö hosted the America's Cup Acts 6&7.

It's no exaggeration to say that Skåne is a golfer's paradise. Within an hour's reach from Malmö you have more than 70 courses to choose from, including some of the very best in Sweden and Europe. Not far from Malmö, for instance, you find Barsebäck G&CC, voted Sweden's best golf course and one of the top ten courses in mainland Europe.

Great shopping & fine food

Rediscover shopping Malmö style! Don't be surprised if you run into loads of people, activities and tempting offers from the 800 shops in the city! Only a few minutes' walk from the main rail station, you will find Stortorget (the Main Square) and its smaller neighbor Lilla Torg (the Little Square). Lilla Torg is famous for its outdoor cafés and bars in the summertime, and is a perfect starting point from which to discover the old town encircled by the city's canals, as well as the fascinating downtown area - perfect for shopping, entertainment and over 300 cafés and restaurants. Distances are short, and large department stores and small, fashionable boutiques can all be found within easy walking distance. Hansa, Triangeln and the newly built Baltzar City are some of the larger shopping malls located along the pedestrian zone. Mention Skåne and Scandinavian people immediately think of food. Skåne has a long history of delicious cooking and skilled chefs. Swedish herring, eel and goose are just a few
